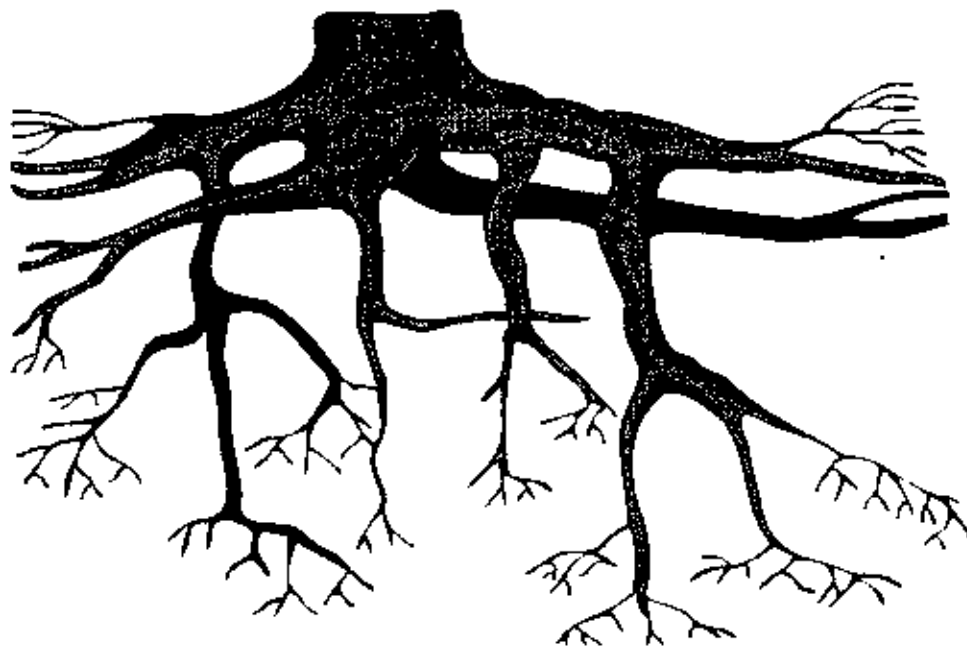
ISLAMIC BELIEFS PART I SUMMARY

Kalima/Shahādah

1. The kalima is also known as the **Shahādah**
2. The first part of the Shahādah is 'Lā ilāha il lal lāh' and it means 'There is no God but Allāh'.
3. A **Muwahhid** believes that there is only one God. A Christian, A Jew, and a Muslim are all Muwahhid.
4. Allāh sent messengers or Prophets to teach us how Allāh wants us to live so that we can be good Muslims.
5. The second part of the Shahādah is 'Muhammadun rasūlul lāh' and it means that Prophet Muhammad (SAW) is the Prophet of Allāh. Belief in the first two parts of the shahādah make us **Muslims**.
6. Prophet Muhammad (SAW) is the leader of the Muslims. But what happened after him?
7. The third part of the kalima is 'Alī yun walī yul lāh, Wasīyu rasūlil lāh' which means that Imām 'Alī (AS) is the walī (friend) of Allāh and he is the wasī (successor) of the Prophet of Allāh.
8. So Imām 'Alī (AS) became the leader and teacher of Muslims after Prophet Muhammad (SAW).
9. The belief that Imām 'Alī (AS) is our leader after the Prophet is known as the **Wilāyat**.
10. Our belief in the Wilāyat makes us **Shr'ah** Muslims.

Usūl ad-Dīn

(Roots of Religion)



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THE USŪL AD-DĪN

The *usūl ad-dīn* are the roots of our religion. They are an important part of our faith. Right now we will be learning the names of the *usūl ad-dīn*. Later on, we will go into their meaning and learn what they are all about and why they are such an important part of our religion.

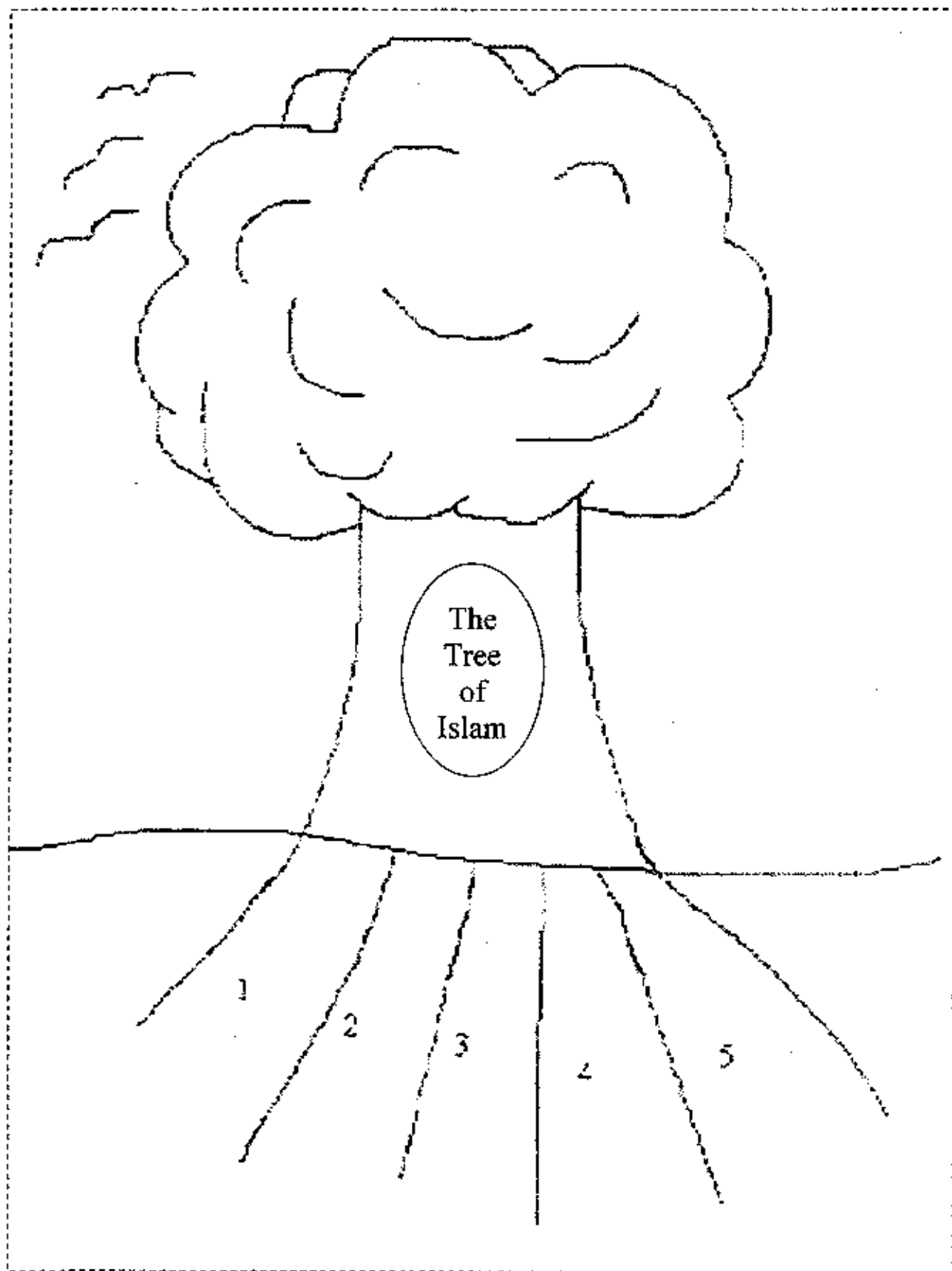

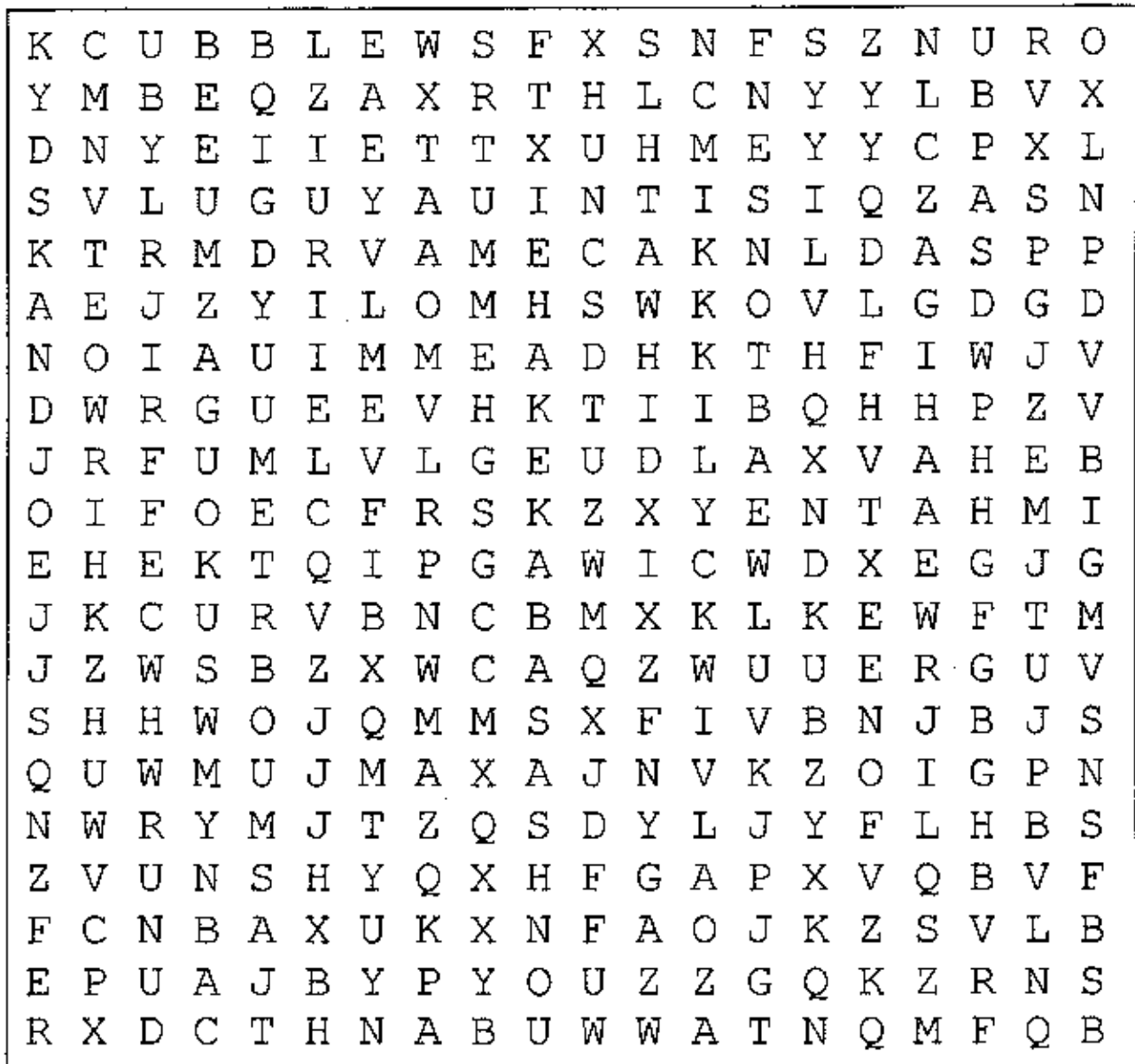

WHO IS ALLĀH?

The people kept asking Prophet Muhammad (SAW) who Allāh was.

Does He have a partner?

Does He have parents?

Does He need anything?

Is there someone or something that is like Him?

The angel Jibra'īl brought the following ayāt of the Qur'ān from Allāh to answer the people's questions:

بِسْمِ اللّٰهِ الرَّحْمٰنِ الرَّحِیْمِ

(I begin) in the name of Allāh, the Kind, the Merciful.

قُلْ هُوَ اللّٰهُ اَحَدٌ

Say 'He, Allāh, is One.

اللّٰهُ الصَّمَدُ

Allāh, The Independent.

لَمْ يَلِدْ وَلَمْ يُولَدْ

He does not give birth and neither was He given birth to.

وَلَمْ يَكُنْ لَهُ كُفُوًا اَحَدٌ

And there is none like Him.

I LOVE ALLĀH!

الْحَمْدُ لِلَّهِ رَبِّ الْعَالَمِينَ

All praise is for Allāh, the Lord of the worlds.

Allāh made me and looks after me. He knows when I am happy and when I am sad. He knows when I am good and when I am naughty. He has given me everything. I love Allāh.

Allāh loves me too and He wants to talk to me. That is why He sent us the Qur'ān, the Prophets and Ma'sūmīn (AS).

But Allāh wants me to talk to Him too so in the Qur'ān and through Prophet Muhammad (SAW) and his Ahlul Bayt (AS) He has taught me how to pray salāt. Salāt is talking to Allāh.

I can talk to Allāh anywhere about anything. He always hears and understands. He hears me if I whisper or if I shout or even if I think of something in my mind. However, when I stand for salāt I pray the way He wants me to because I love Him and I want to do what He says.

الله أكبر

Allāh is Greater than anything or anyone.

He has made me so He knows what is right for me and what is wrong for me. Allāh wants me to talk to Him through salāt three times a day with five prayers.

Some prayers are longer than others but I just love talking to Allāh.

Allāh wants me to pray with other people as well. The Prophet (SAW) has said that salāt has greater power when we pray together in Jamā'at. I try to pray my salāt in Jamā'at as much as possible.

'ADĀLAT (JUSTICE)

'Adālat (also called 'Adālah) means to put everything in its right place. If you were to wear your shoes on your head it would not be a just act.

Sometimes we confuse 'adālat with being equal. If everyone in the classroom was given the same marks in their test whether they did well or not, it would not be fair (just) although it would be giving everyone equal marks.

To believe in the 'adālat of Allāh means to believe that:

1. Allāh is fair to everyone. He never does anything wrong.
2. He never forces anyone to do bad things and then punishes them.
3. He will always reward those who obey Him.

NABUWWAT

Nabuwwat is the third part of the Usūl ad-Dīn.

Nabuwwat means the belief in the Prophets. A Nabī means a Prophet. Allāh has sent down 124,000 Prophets to teach us and guide us to the right path. The first Prophet was Prophet Ādam (AS) and the last Prophet was Prophet Muhammad (SAW).

All of the Prophets are known as **Ma'sūm**. That means that they do not commit any sins. They have taught us to listen to Allāh. And to thank Him for everything that He has given us.

Some Prophets brought new messages from Allāh. And some Prophets taught the message of Allāh. Allāh also gave many Prophets the power to perform miracles. For example, one great miracle was when Prophet Mūsā (AS), by the will of Allāh, changed a stick into a snake. There are many other miracles that were performed by many of our Prophets.

Everyone should go to the library and read a book on different miracles that have been done.

You should always remember who your Prophets were and what they did for us. Because of them we know that we have to believe in Allāh. Whenever you hear the name of Prophet Muhammad (SAW) you should always recite the **Salawāt**:

اللَّهُمَّ صَلِّ عَلَى مُحَمَّدٍ وَآلِ مُحَمَّدٍ

The salawāt means: *"Oh Allāh, send your blessings upon Muhammad, and the Ahlul Bayt"*.

IMĀMAT

Imāmat is the fourth part of the Usūl ad-Dīn.

Just like Prophets, Imāms are very important to Muslims. They came after the Prophets to teach the Muslims about Islam and what Allāh has said. Imāms are also perfect; they do not commit any sins.

Allāh has chosen 12 Imāms to guide us and teach us the Qur'ān and the message of Islam.

These 12 Imāms can also perform some miracles like our Prophets.

The twelve Imāms are:

1. Imām 'Alī (AS)
2. Imām Hasan (AS)
3. Imām Husayn (AS)
4. Imām 'Alī Zaynul 'Ābidīn (AS)
5. Imām Muhammad Al-Bāqir (AS)
6. Imām Ja'far As-Sādiq (AS)
7. Imām Mūsā Al-Kāzim (AS)
8. Imām 'Alī Ar-Ridā (AS)
9. Imām Muhammad At-Taqī (AS)
10. Imām 'Alī An-Naqī (AS)
11. Imām Hasan Al-'Askarī (AS)
12. Imām Muhammad Al-Mahdi (AS)

When you hear the name of our 12th Imām (Imām Muhammad Al-Mahdi), you should always bow your head and recite the Salawāt out of respect for him. Our Twelfth Imām is still alive today but, by the command of Allāh, he is hidden (called GHAYBAT). He will stay hidden until Allāh tells him to come out. Even though he is hidden he helps us Muslims to follow the commands of Allāh.














Qiyāmat means the Day of **Judgement**. As Muslims, we all have to believe in the Day of Judgement. This is the day when Allāh will bring us back to life, and ask us what we have done in this world. A recording of our life will be shown to us and we have to tell Allāh why we did those things.

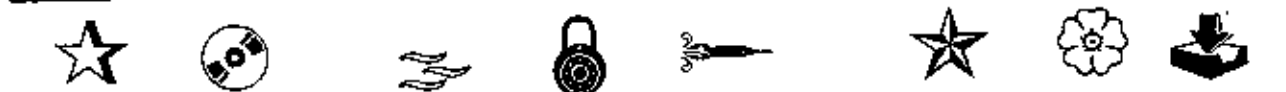
For all the good things that we have done in the world, Allāh will reward us. But, for all the bad things that we have done, Allāh will punish us.

You will get a report about your life. If you get the report in your right hand, you will go to Jannat (Paradise or Heaven), but if you get the report in your left hand you will go to Jahannam (Hell). So, if you do anything bad in this world, you should ask Allāh for forgiveness and never do it again, so that on the Day of Judgement, you can go to Jannat.

Whenever you ask for du‘ā, you should always ask Allāh to help all of the Muslims do good so that we all go to Jannat.

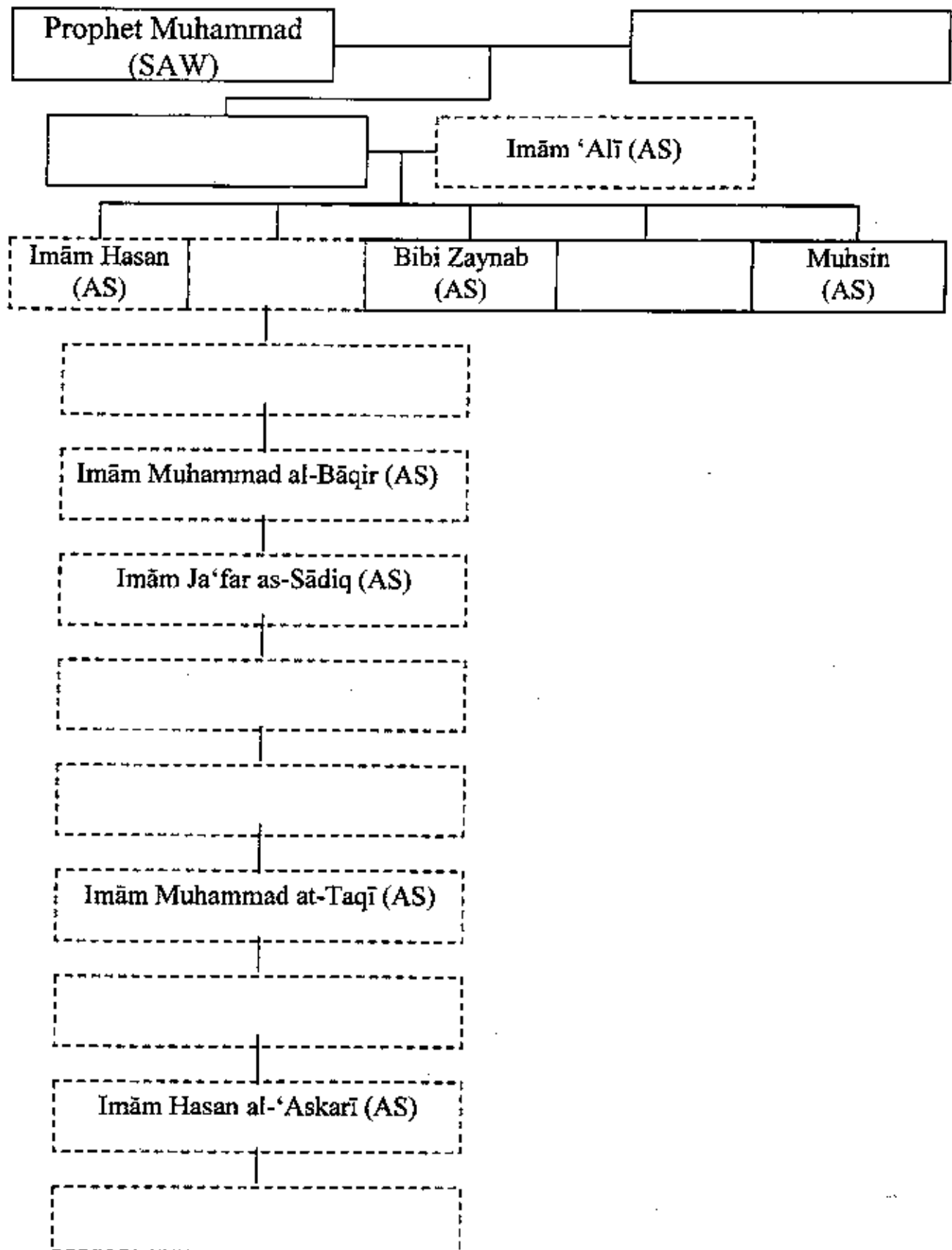
